### **REGULAR MEETING OF SOUTH EUCLID CITY COUNCIL**

Council President Jane Goodman called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

#### Roll Call

#### **Opening Meeting of Council:**

President Goodman called the Open Meeting of Council to order and invited the audience to address Council:

- Ms. Adrienne Martin, 4418 Elmwood Road, stated she was concerned about criminal activity that she spoke about at the last meeting that targeted senior citizens. Mayor Welo reported that the person had been captured in Lyndhurst and is now in County Jail.
- John Savani, 1900 South Belvoir, stated that he is the owner of the apartments on Greenvale Blvd adjacent to Dogtropolis. Mr. Savani stated that the issues of noise from the barking dogs has improved and they are encouraged by the recent improvements. Mr. Savani stated that Law Director Lograsso is scheduling a meeting with all parties to discuss soundproofing. Mr. Savani indicated that soundproofing had been purchases, but not yet installed. Mr. Savani stated that they are concerned about a noise ordinance that was passed and the issue of using a decibel meter to measure nuisance versus continuous noise complaints of dogs barking. Council President Goodman stated that City Council will be looking at the City's noise ordinances to evaluate and change if necessary and a committee meeting will be held.
- Chuck Turner, 4549 Lilac, stated that he is being discriminated against and is not getting equal justice. Mr. Turner stated that it has been three-and-a-half years since he was assaulted by a police officer on Mayfield Road and nothing has been done.

# **Report of Council Committees:**

## Zoning & Planning Committee

Councilman Russell reported that two meting were held to discuss the renewal of the vacant building registration ordinance that is set to expire at the end of the year. Another meeting will be scheduled to continue discussions. A second meeting was held to discuss the proposed six-month medical marijuana moratorium and was recommended by committee for passage by City Council.

#### Committee of the Whole

Council President Goodman reported that the committee met regarding the soft recyclables legislation and the committee looked at the agreement with the proposed vendor. The legislation will be on for third reading at the next meeting.

## Mayor's Report:

- Mayor Welo reported on the completion and dedication of South Euclid's third Purple Heart home for an injured veteran. South Euclid has more Purple Heart Homes than any city in the country, and 150-200 people attended the dedication event on Sunday. The Mayor reported on several community events including the South Euclid United Church of Christ Jazz Fest, First Baptist Church's Faith Walk and the E-Recycling Roundup event.
- City Engineer Andy Blackley gave an update on road repair and infrastructure projects and stated that the 2016 watermain restoration has started on Greenvale, including tree lawn work. Mr. Blackley stated that he followed up with Dominion East Ohio Gas on complaints that they were not restoring tree lawns properly and Dominion stated that their contractors will re-double their efforts to properly complete the projects.
- Housing Manager Sally Martin thanked city council for their discussion of the vacant building registration ordinance renewal and she looks forward to continuing discussion.
